The change in the weather reminds me of life; few things remain the same. In fact, the one thing you can count on in life is change. It is better not to become too comfortable with the way things are, for it will not last. Yet as Christians we must remind ourselves, "Therefore we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day" (II Cor. 4:16).

The prodigal son found himself on the bottom, the result of bad choices. According to scripture, "But when he came to his senses, he said, How many of my father's hired men have more than enough bread, but I am dying here with hunger! I will get up and go to my father" (Luke 15:17-18). He realized he had the power to change his life for the better. The opportunity to change our lives with God's help is indeed a blessing.
